### Scholarships of the Balassi Institute of Hungary

The Balassi Institute, an arm's length Agency of the Hungarian government established for the promotion of Hungarian culture and language abroad, offers scholarships for Canadian students of Hungarian origin to study in Hungary; and also offers scholarships and grants for academics, teachers of the Hungarian language abroad, artists and others to enable them to study or undertake research at universities and other institutes of higher education approved by the Ministry of Education (and compatible with the EU system of education).

The Canada-Hungary Educational Foundation has signed an agreement with the Balassi Institute to help administer Canadian applications, especially the one for young Canadian students of Hungarian origin to study in Hungary for a year. Last year, through the efforts of the Foundation, 10 individuals applied and 7 subsequently were accepted/went to Hungary for the academic year 2009-10. Please pass information about these opportunities to those who may be interested. Those members who teach in Canada or know potentially
